Dear Members,

It gives me great pleasure to provide the foreword and welcome to this, my third Annual Report as Chairman, the 108th Annual Report of our Association

2020-21 has been a challenge for everyone in dealing with the COVID-19 pandemic. The effects continue to this day, with our Association not only facing the challenges head on, but thanks to our Management team and their dedication and hard work, we are now better placed in providing outstanding service to you our membership, as well as to our stakeholders through their ability to find practical and creative solutions to the challenges faced in the last year.

Some of the highlights for me have been being the development of our online training courses to enable the Association to futureproof itself, the delivery of an online Convention to an excellent standard, the appointment of two umpires to every match in the Men's Premier and Shires competitions once again, and to see New South Wales umpires being appointed to every national final played this season – a remarkable achievement. Congratulations to all members and our Management team on achieving these highlights, and thank you for your dedication, availability and adaptability.

Our Executive Officer Troy Penman has ably led our team ably in the last year. Troy has done a commendable job and his commitment to the role has been outstanding. He has displayed strong and decisive leadership, innovation, and taken the Association forward in this challenging period dealing with the pandemic. He has led his team with energy and pride and I am pleased to acknowledge him for his exceptional contribution across the season. Our Association is in fine hands.

After the experiences of lockdown and not being able hold physical meetings in 2020, our Management team have successfully run our Annual Convention, Annual General Meeting, Ordinary General Meetings and numerous training courses and SCA playing condition sessions online. This has allowed both our members and prospective members the opportunity to learn and engage in a period of time where many associations have failed to remain connected. One ongoing legacy is that our Annual and Ordinary General Meetings are now held in a hybrid fashion to allow members to attend in person or via the comfort of your home.

This enables many of our regionally based members to attend meetings where they previously have not had the chance to do so. I encourage all of our members to take advantage of these opportunities going forward with our meetings now being structured to cater for all in the State.

As a result of being able to continue to train and educate new prospective members, we continue to grow in numbers as an Association, now 1382 members strong, welcoming 183 new members in 2020-21. Thanks to our Education Officer, Ben Treloar along with Claire Polosak as Umpire Educator and her role in Female Umpire Engagement. In a challenging period for training and recruitment for many sports around the world, Ben has led the way in ensuring our Association was able to continue training via online means and has developed an outstanding program for prospective new members. For Claire, each season sees more and more females attending courses, joining our Association and officiating on field. Claire is an excellent educator and a great support to the Association staff at Cricket NSW. So many of our training courses for prospective umpires on the 2017 Code of the Laws of Cricket were conducted via Zoom, although we were able to run some face to face sessions with the cooperation of our local affiliates. Our membership thrives on education and development, and this year due to the pandemic our Convention went online with various live and recorded sessions available prior to the commencement of the season, which was an outstanding success and again showcased to many more members that would normally not have attended our annual education and development weekend. Further training throughout the year, both in professional development sessions led by our trainers and educators, our Education Officer and the Examination Committee at our Ordinary General Meetings provided members great opportunities to maximise their learning and game day preparation. To all those involved in education, my sincere thanks.

Bede Sajowitz does an outstanding job in his role of Administrator for our Association. Bede is our first line of response to the many and varied queries and responses required for our Association. Our In Black and White publications are a great source of information each edition, and we simply would not be able to provide the exceptional service to our membership were it not for Bede's hard work and dedication. Much of his work is behind the scenes and we would not be able function were it not for Bede's contribution. This Annual Report has Bede's stamp on it and I commend him for all he does.

I also wish to acknowledge the support and guidance provided to the Management team by Darren Goodger as Head of Competitions and Officiating at Cricket NSW. Since being seconded in 2019 Darren has continued to dedicate much of his time and efforts into the Association and its members. His work as State Umpiring Manger continues to lead the way around the country and through his toil NSW umpires continue to represent 50% of all contracted umpires with Cricket Australia.

To our Co-Patrons, Brian Booth MBE, Alan Davidson AM MBE, Dick French OAM and Graham Reed, I again thank you for your patronage, support and interest in our Association over many years. I acknowledge the support of Cricket NSW CEO, Lee Germon, for his support and faith he places in the Association to manage umpiring affairs in New South Wales. We have a successful relationship with Cricket NSW. We should not take this for granted. Cricket NSW has been a wonderful supporter of our Association and have led the country in their response to the pandemic, retaining staff and ensuring competitions our state were able to take place in a safe environment. Their leadership during the last year is greatly appreciated. From the Sydney Cricket Association, I acknowledge Committee of Management Chair Graham Gorrie, NSW Premier Cricket Manager Roy Formica and Competitions Officer Sean Mantle for their ongoing support and good working relationship. I also thank SCA Code of Conduct Commissioner John McGruther, for his continuing support of match officials and advocacy for the Spirit of Cricket. Congratulations goes to Ben Treloar on his first-class debut in the Sheffield Shield match at the Adelaide Oval between South Australia and New South Wales. We are also represented by Honorary member David Gilbert who serves as a Cricket Australia Match Referee. Congratulations also to Ian Wright on his Men's Test debut as scorer in the SCG New Year's Test between Australia and India. It was also so pleasing to see so many of our umpires and scorers taking their opportunities in 2020-21, especially those who were called upon to officiate in COVID bubbles throughout the season.

Whilst we celebrate the successes of those at the top end of the ladder, many of our members continue to go unnoticed in their dedication to serving both the game and the Association in lower grades, metropolitan districts and also across our country regions. We are not all blessed with outstanding facilities and the challenge remains in making cricket both relevant and attractive to the next generation. Association Awards

George Borwick Memorial Award

The winner of the George Borwick Memorial Award for season 2020-21 was Sharad Patel.

The George Borwick Memorial Award is named after our former Association President and Patron who umpired 24 Test matches, including in every Test of the Bodyline series. It was instituted in 1982 to perpetuate his memory.

George Borwick's dedication and commitment to umpiring and the Association was second-to-none in Australian umpiring. He enjoyed complete respect, was a loyal servant, a member for more than 55 years and is now a member of the Association's Hall of Fame.

The award is presented annually to the member who exemplifies the spirit of George Borwick's contribution by their efforts both on and off the field during the season. A points system is used to determine the winner taking into account: availability, meeting attendance and the average mark from captains' assessments.

The Award was keenly contested this season, and in the end, there was just 0.33 of a mark between first and sixth.

Due to a tie for sixth the top seven in the 2020-21 George Borwick Memorial Award were:

Andrew Coates, Darren Foster, Bob McGregor, Sharad Patel, Bede Sajowitz, Ben Treloar, Andrew Yarad.

Sharad has displayed outstanding commitment to the Association by attending every Ordinary General Meeting between September and March, the Rules Night and the Convention. He is a member of the NSW State Umpire Panel.

He was also appointed to officiate in both the WBBL and WNCL throughout the season.

He also made his debut at 4-day State Second XI level when he officiated the match between NSW Metro and ACT/NSW Country at Rosedale Oval. Sharad is a highly respected official and was appointed to the NSW Premier Cricket Second Grade Grand Final.

Sharad has now umpired 95 SCA matches since joining the Association in 2012, 49 of which have been in First Grade.

During the season he officiated 13 SCA matches with captains praising his accurate judgement and decisiveness. His match average from captains was an exceptional 4.92 out of 5.

This was Sharad's second time winning the George Borwick Memorial Award.

E. F. Wykes OAM Association Medal

The winner of the E. F. Wykes OAM Association Medal for 2020-21 was Pat Holt.

The Ted Wykes Medal was struck in honour of our late President and Patron. Ted was also a long-serving Vice-President of New South Wales Cricket Association.

Ted was a Test Umpire and a person who was a great friend and mentor to many in our Association and so generous with the time he gave to improving the Association. A man of few words, Ted was a true leader by his actions and commitment. He was widely respected in the game as a man of the highest integrity.

The winner of the Ted Wykes Medal must be a member of an affiliated association who has displayed excellence and commitment to that association on and off the field throughout the season by way of meeting attendance, availability and consistent umpiring performance.

Pat joined the Association in 2011 and enjoyed an outstanding season in qualifying for this award. He officiated in all 20 rounds of cricket conducted in the Far North Coast Cricket Council, including fixtures in the LJ Hooker League, Coastal League and Northern Rivers Cricket League. At representative level he umpired the three-day Bradman Cup Carnival in Tamworth and the Women's Regional Bash Final at North Sydney Oval.

Pat's nomination, in the view of the board, was the standout from those received in addressing and meeting the criteria. The nomination articulated how Pat exhibited excellent presentation, a demonstrated high level of concentration, confidence, and strength in his match management, as well as maintaining an admirable rapport with captains and players. Pat's teamwork during the season was of the highest quality, he responded positively to feedback and enjoyed the entire umpiring experience throughout 2020-21.

Pat is highly respected in North Coast cricket and across the country by his peers.

New South Wales Premier Cricket Panel Awards

The Panel Awards recognise excellence for the 'Umpire of the Year' in each grade as determined by captains' assessments throughout the season. To be eligible for a Panel Award a member must have officiated in at least 10 SCA matches.

Captains assess each umpire in terms of their decision making, decisiveness, match management and communication skills, concentration and level of positive attitude to the game. At the end of the season the umpire with the highest overall average wins the panel award.

Panel 4

The winner of the Panel 4 Award for season 2020-21 was Nathan Harvey.

Nathan joined the Association in September 2019 and has now officiated in 20 SCA matches. He received outstanding feedback from captains for his effective match management and communication whilst highlighting his ability to maintain concentration throughout long days on the field.

Nathan officiated 12 matches this season and made his Third Grade debut in Round 13, achieving an excellent match average across the season of 4.5 out of 5 in NSW Premier Cricket

Panel 3

The winner of the Panel 3 Award was Allan Owens.

Allan joined the Association in September 2018 and has now officiated in 34 SCA matches. His consistency of performance saw him appointed to five matches in Second Grade to further his umpiring. Feedback from captains highlighted his decisiveness and excellent match management.

A most capable umpire who finished the season with the excellent match average of 4.76 out of 5 in NSW Premier Cricket.

Panel 2

The winner of the Panel 2 Award for season 2020-21 was David Abbey.

David joined the Association in September 2013 and has now stood in 114 SCA matches, including making his First-Grade debut in Round 13.

This season he officiated 14 matches with captains praising his effective match management, enjoyment for the game and his ability to maintain concentration.

This is his third panel award having won the Panel 3 award in both season 2015-16 and 2017-18.

He finished the season with an excellent match average of 4.72 out of 5.

Panel 1

The winner of the Panel 1 Award for season 2020-21 was Darren Goodger.

Darren had an extraordinary season with an incredible match average from First Grade captains of 5 out of 5. Captains praised him across the board for all aspects of his umpiring, particularly commending his match management and decision making.

Having joined the Association in 1993, he was made a Life Member in 2009 and wins the Panel 1 Award for an unprecedented sixth successive season and has now won the award for the eleventh time.



With 183 new members, the Association has grown in size for a fourth consecutive year – an overall increase of 62 a result of growth in Ordinary, Principal and Scorer members with only a slight decrease in Full members, whilst one affiliated association was unfortunately disbanded, all others affiliated once again for 2020-21.

Credit for the outstanding number of new members is owed to the Training team, who were challenged by the impact of the pandemic, which prevented the winter training program from being carried out in its traditional format.

Ben Treloar and Claire Polosak were instrumental in revamping the training and development offered to prospective umpires and current members as the Association moved onto virtual platforms. Adrian Tham and the Scorers' Committee were enthusiastic in returning to face-to-face training, facilitating a number of courses for prospective members across the season both in Sydney and on the Central Coast.

Retention of members is a key focus for the Association, as it provides extra funds for the Association which can be spent on training and development for all members. While we would like to see all members renew each year, we understand that there are a number of things that occur that make it simply not possible for people to continue their membership. The increased pressures of busy lives, family and work commitments, retirement from umpiring, and opportunities to try new things have all contributed among other things.

It is with sadness and regret that this year, we note the passing of members Greg Carmock, Ian Findlay, Gerry Forliano, Denis Graham and John Rose. All contributed to the Association in a positive manner during their lifetimes and they are recognised in the obituaries.

Obituaries - Bede Sajowitz

GREG CARMOCK

Greg joined the Association in 2016 and was upgraded to Full membership the following year.

Greg officiated 22 matches in men's Sydney Cricket Association competitions. He was a tireless worker in the Northern Suburbs District (NSD) both with the cricket and umpires' associations. Greg encouraged many of his NSD colleagues to join NSWCUSA to improve their umpiring and knowledge.

In 2018-19, he was awarded the Panel 4 medal recognising an outstanding season. Greg was a strong supporter of the Association and looked to attend and contribute to many Association functions.

IAN FINDLAY

Affectionately known as 'Finners', Ian was a highly respected person in Orange District Cricket Association, Mitchell Cricket Council and Western Zone. Ian served the game with distinction as an umpire and administrator making a remarkable contribution.

He re-joined NSWCUSA in 2017 and in that time has umpired State Challenge carnivals in Dubbo being a valued member of the match official team. Ian was the winner of the Peter Weston Medal in 2014-15 as Mitchell Cricket Council Umpire of the Year.

He has been a long serving chairman of the Orange Branch of Mitchell Cricket Umpires' Association being a wonderful host of many NSWCUSA training courses held in Orange over the past decade. He possessed a genuine commitment to excellence, a thirst for knowledge and self-improvement. Ian also served as president of Orange City Cricket Club.

lan officiated at representative level in Mitchell Cricket Council and Western Zone fixtures. The Central Western Daily paid tribute to Ian Findlay on 26 October as a man who brought fairness, skill and business acumen to cricket in Orange.

GERRY FORLIANO

Gerry joined the Association in 2003 and was upgraded to Full membership the following year.

In his seventeen years as an active umpire, he officiated in 246 men's SCA matches and many as a member of the Sydney Women's Cricket Umpires' Association. In 2012-13, he was awarded the Panel two Medal recognising an outstanding season. He was a well-respected and highly-regarded match official and administrator with great people skills and the gift of the common touch, a close friend to many members.

He spent time as a member of the SCA Women's Sub-Committee and was heavily involved in mentoring and guiding new umpires sharing his experience with them in both Men's and Women's Premier Cricket.

DENIS GRAHAM

Denis joined the Association in November 1980, commencing his umpiring that season, becoming a Full member at the 1981 Annual General Meeting.

In an eleven-season career umpiring in Sydney Cricket Association competitions, Denis officiated in 112 First Grade matches – though he officiated in all grades, reaching a total of 162 matches.

Denis made his first-class debut in the 1990-91 season, umpiring the season-opening Sheffield Shield fixture between New South Wales and Tasmania at the SCG which took place from 2-5 November.

Later in the season, he officiated his second Sheffield Shield match as New South Wales hosted South Australia at the SCG, beginning on 19 January.

In both matches, his partner was fellow member, now Association Life member, lan Thomas.

In addition to his two first-class matches, Mr. Graham oversaw three matches with List A status.

His List A debut came in 1987-88 McDonald's Cup – as the national one-day tournament was then known – as New South Wales hosted Tasmania at the SCG on 6 March.

The following season, Denis again umpired New South Wales and Tasmania at the SCG in their FAI Cup match on 26 February.

He experienced international cricket in 1990-91 when he officiated a one-day tour match between New South Wales and the visiting New Zealanders in Wollongong.

In addition to club cricket and professional cricket, he also umpired in other representative competitions including at Second XI level and NSW Country representative tournaments – including the Final of the 1989-90 Tooheys Limited-Overs Country Cup.

BRETT McMILLAN

Brett joined the Association in October 1986 before commencing active umpiring in the 1987-88 season.

During the recently completed 2020-21 season, his 34th year as a member, Brett officiated five matches in NSW Men's Premier Cricket.

This saw his career total reach 289 matches, with 59 of those matches coming in Second Grade – in addition to overseeing matches in NSW Women's Premier Cricket.

JOHN ROSE

John joined the Association in February 2020. He joined the Far North Coast Cricket Umpires' and Scorers' Association earlier during the 2019-20 season. He was a regular standing in first grade matches for the Northern Rivers Cricket League.

Captains were very pleased with the match management and decisions from John and expressed their desire to have him at all their games. John was much loved by all members in the FNCCUSA for his friendly and happy demeaner and was always in attendance at the Association meetings.

John's officiating career was rather short, but he was well known in this area for his all-round cricketing ability. John played for many years as a right-arm opening bowler and hard-hitting lower order batsman for Western Districts Cricket Club in Lismore - playing alongside a young Adam Gilchrist at one stage.

John also represented Lismore in Far North Coast inter-district competitions for a number of years, before heading north to play Brisbane Grade Cricket.

He represented Northern NSW Emu Colts in 1976.

The following citations were read out by Board Chair Mark Hughes:

Peter Done

Peter Done has been a loyal servant to cricket umpiring in New South Wales.

He has been the heart and soul of the Shoalhaven District Cricket Umpires' Association (SDCUA) for two decades. Peter has an impressive resume of representative umpiring appointments, including matches at all levels in the Southern Cricket Zone representative program.

Peter has also officiated in numerous representative matches in Country Cricket NSW programs, including the NSW Country Cup and Bradman Cup, and in recent seasons has been involved in CNSW State Challenge carnivals. Peter also officiated at the U17 NSW Country Carnival held on the South Coast in 2001-02 and the NSW Country Cup finals series at Raymond Terrace in 2002-03.

Peter has umpired 458 matches in his time as a member of NSWCUSA, having joined the Association in 2001. He has been appointed to umpire the First Grade Grand Final in the Shoalhaven District Cricket Association on 19 occasions.

Peter has served umpiring administration with distinction, being a member of the Southern Zone Cricket Umpires' Association Executive Committee for 18 years. He is the current SDCUA Secretary / Treasurer, having served in this position for 20 consecutive seasons. It is no surprise that Peter has been honoured with the privilege of Life membership of Shoalhaven District Cricket Umpires' Association.

Ivan joined the Association in September 2001 and was upgraded to Full membership in 2002. He is an active member of the Sydney Shires Cricket Umpires' Association (SSCUA) and has been since the formation of the Association in season 2001-02. Ivan is member number 11 in their records.

On Saturday 10 February 2018, Ivan became only the second member of the SSCUA to officiate in 300 matches in Shires competitions. In acknowledging the milestone, the SSCUA provided the following in its Annual Report, "Ivan is a loyal and committed member to our Association being available to umpire just about every round each season. He also makes himself available for every possible Sunday either in the Frank Gray Shield or Masters and Classics fixtures. Ivan is well respected amongst our members and has a very high attendance rate at our meetings."

Ivan's dedication to the Sydney Shires competition highlights his passion for cricket. He displays genuine commitment to improving his game. Testimony to his high level of diligence is that after 15 seasons of umpiring he was awarded the SSCUA Most Improved Umpire in season 2014-15.

Ivan is a most worthy recipient of Principal membership and we thank him for his significant contribution to Shires Cricket and the SSCUA.

Pat Kerin OAM

Joining the Association in April 2003 Pat Kerin has made a sterling contribution to both the Cootamundra District Cricket Umpires' Association and Cootamundra District Cricket Association. He was made a Life member of Cootamundra District Cricket Association in 1995 and has been Secretary for an incredible 31 years.

In 2004 Pat was elected Secretary, Treasurer and Appointments Officer of the reformed Cootamundra District Cricket Umpires' Association. Pat still holds these positions. With the reforming of the Association, Pat set up the Association and presented a Constitution which was adopted.

In 2005 Pat took on the position of Riverina Cricket Zone Umpire Representative, a position he readily accepted. As a part of his role as Zone Representative, Pat has coordinated several winter training courses across the Riverina.

The 2013 NSWCUSA Annual Convention was held in Cootamundra and Pat was instrumental in organising the weekend and ensuring that all attendees felt welcomed.

With umpiring numbers low in the region Pat has made a committed effort to be available nearly every weekend of the cricket season. This includes many matches in Northern Riverina Cricket Council and Riverina Zone competitions which are held on Sundays.

Pat has stood in Country Plate Carnivals at Wellington, Forbes and Gunnedah and in recent seasons has been involved umpiring matches in the Kookaburra Cup and CNSW State Challenge.

From 1997 until present, he has been continuously involved with the Riverina Cricket Zone in numerous capacities including Publicity Officer, Zone Umpire Representative, Annual Report Editor and Committee of Management Delegate to New South Wales Country Cricket Association during which time Pat served as Chair of the Country Umpire Sub-Committee.

Pat is a frequent visitor to Sydney to officiate in NSW Premier Cricket matches.

In April 2007, Pat was awarded the prestigious E.F. Wykes OAM Association Medal awarded for his commitment to umpiring in the Cootamundra District CUA.

In June 2007, in the Queen's Birthday Honours List, Pat was awarded a Medal of the Order of Australia [OAM] 'For service to cricket and Australian Rules football in the Cootamundra region.'

In February 2008, Pat attended the Allan Border Medal event to represent NSWCUSA a reward for his outstanding service to umpiring and the game.

In June 2015 Pat was awarded Life membership of the Cootamundra District CUA.

Pat Kerin has made an incredible contribution to cricket officiating in the Riverina and Principal membership of NSWCUSA is appropriate recognition for his service and dedication.

Graham Moon

Graham Moon first commenced umpiring in Cootamundra in the late 1990s. Graham is an umpire from Riverina Zone residing at The Rock. He joined NSWCUSA in April 2003 and was upgraded to Full membership in 2004.

Graham served as president of the Cootamundra District Cricket Umpires Association (CDCUA) for 10 years. His outstanding service to Cootamundra umpiring saw him rewarded with Life membership of CDCUA in 2015.

Graham was the inaugural JDI Cup Umpire of the Year in 2004-05 and went on to win the award a further three times.

Wonderful recognition came for Graham during the 2009-10 season when he was awarded the E.F. Wykes OAM Association Medal. This award recognised Graham's dedication to umpiring on and off the field.

He officiated regularly in regional representative competitions, which was highlighted by standing in seven Country Plate finals. Graham also stood in a Country Cup final. He has been a regular appointee to matches in the Kookaburra Cup, Bradman Cup, Country Colts and CNSW State Challenge, ever-reliable, composed and dependable.

Graham Moon now umpires in the Wagga Wagga District Cricket Association.

A highlight for any umpire is to officiate on the Sydney Cricket Ground and Graham received this privilege on Australia Day 2020 when he stood with Neil Smith in a Plan B Regional T20 Bash semi-final.

During season 2019-20, Graham umpired his 500th match as a member of NSWCUSA.

Over the past 17 years, Graham has made a significant contribution to both the Cootamundra District Cricket Umpires' Association and the Wagga Wagga Cricket Umpires' Association. He is a worthy recipient of Principal membership and we thank him for his contribution to Country Cricket and the NSWCUSA.

Drew Morrow

Drew joined the Association in September 1988 and was upgraded to Full membership in 1990. Drew spent close to ten years officiating in Sydney Grade Cricket, where he regularly officiated on the Second Grade panel. During this time Drew officiated 105 SCA matches of which 21 were in Second Grade.

Following his time in Sydney Grade Cricket Drew moved to umpiring in the GPS competition where he has spent over 20 years on the First XI panel serving the game he loves. During his time with the GPS he developed a close friendship with Association's Hall of Fame inductee Tom Brooks and for a number of years the two of them umpired exclusively together in GPS and social matches such was their friendship.

John is a Life member of South Coast District Cricket Umpires' Association and currently officiates in the Cricket Illawarra competition as a member of Illawarra CUA.

Following the conclusion of his distinguished first-class playing career, Rod joined the Association in 2003 and was upgraded to Full membership the following year.

With his playing experience Rod quickly showed his understanding of and feel for the game and moved through the umpiring ranks.

He officiated the Fifth Grade Final in season 2002-03, only a handful of months into his umpiring career.

In 2008 Rod was promoted to the International Panel of ICC Umpires and on 11 January, 2009 Rod made his International T20 debut in Melbourne in the game many remember for David Warner's exploits opening the batting when also on debut at that level. A week later Rod made his ODI debut in Hobart when Australia played South Africa.

Rod made his Men's Test debut in Hamilton in February 2010 as New Zealand hosted Bangladesh. He has now umpired 71 Men's Test matches, 84 Men's One Day Internationals, and 35 Men's T20 Internationals. Rod's most recent significant international appointment was as TV Umpire for the ICC Cricket World Cup Final in July 2019.

Since joining the Elite Panel of ICC Umpires in 2010, Rod has continued to represent NSWCUSA and Australian Cricket on the world stage with composure and distinction. He has always been a sincere advocate for umpiring and NSWCUSA.

Rod Tucker is a truly deserving recipient of the honour of Principal membership for his outstanding performances as an international cricket umpire whilst being a member of this Association.

Lindsay Wood OAM

Lindsay joined the Association in September 1996 and was upgraded to Full membership in 1997. Lindsay has spent his life contributing to cricket and education in the Maitland area. He is highly respected as a person of outstanding character.

Since commencing his umpiring career Lindsay has officiated 365 matches in the Maitland District Cricket Association, 119 of which have been in First Grade.

He has also officiated 54 matches in junior and senior representative cricket, including officiating in the New South Wales Country Cricket Association Cup held in Singleton.

In season 2010-11 Lindsay was named the Maitland District Cricket Umpires' Association Umpire of the Year receiving the Ernie Jurd Memorial Shield. Lindsay's dedication to the MDCUA saw him awarded Life membership of that Association in 2011.

Lindsay has also contributed strongly off field in administrative roles. As a member of the Hunter Valley Cricket Umpires' Association, Lindsay has served as President from 1997 to 1998 and as Vice President from 1998 to 2008. He served as a member of the HVCUA Executive for 13 consecutive seasons.

In 2008 Lindsay received the Australian Cricket award for 50 years of service to Australian Cricket.

Lindsay was honoured with an Order of Australia Medal (OAM) for services to the sport of Cricket and to the Community in 2013.

Testament to his lengthy involvement in cricket he has also been awarded Life membership of the Maitland District Junior Cricket Association, the Maitland District Cricket Association and the Hunter Valley Cricket Council.

Meetings - Bede Sajowitz

Ordinary General Meetings of the Association were held at 7pm on the first Wednesday of each month between September and April, except for January where no meeting was held.

Throughout the year, all meetings were accessible via Zoom - the December, March and April meetings also saw a limited number of people able to attend in-person at the Stephen and Mark Waugh Pavilion at Bankstown Oval. Public Health Orders and restrictions on gatherings saw the remaining meetings entirely facilitated via Zoom.

Postponed as a result of the pandemic, the Annual General Meeting was held on the first Wednesday of September and a Special General Meeting was held on 7 April to place proposed amendments to the Constitution before members for their approval – both meetings were held prior to OGMs on the same evening.


An average of 138 members attended the scheduled general meetings, which was up considerably from last year, an extremely positive result of meetings becoming more accessible through Zoom and the hybrid format. The increase also highlights the continued growth of the Association as well as the positive spirit and dedication that has been fostered among members.

The opening three meetings of the seasons were the highest attended meetings, likely owing to the combination of being the first Association meetings since the pandemic began and enthusiasm and interest in the season being at its peak – particularly the September OGM which saw the AGM facilitated on the same evening, after six months without an Association meeting.

At the AGM in September, which was held digitally via Zoom, there were 204 members in attendance. No ballots were required at the AGM with Geoff Garland and Mark Hughes the only members to nominate for the two available positions as Board Directors.

Similarly, there was only one nomination each for the positions of Honorary Treasurer and Liaison Officer, which saw Laurie Borg and Neil Findlay respectively return to the roles for 2020-21.

At each Ordinary General Meeting, the Association delivers an agenda which provides information on fellow members and other matters. Information presented includes representative appointments, material of a technical nature as well as various educational and development sessions facilitated by a variety of members and committees. Financial, Administrative and Committee reports are also given at each meeting.

Digital Communication - Bede Sajowitz

Throughout 2020-21, NSWCUSA's online presence continued to grow, which saw more people than ever before exposed to the achievements of the Association's members and the expansive training program.

NSWCUSA's digital content serves a number of purposes, with the significant focus being to promote and publicise the milestones and achievements of the members. Through the online channels, we also engage with potential members through advertising training courses and publish umpire appointments to Premier Cricket and Cricket Australia competitions.

Since the last Annual Report, Association content on Twitter has been viewed by well over 200,000 people, with many more engaged through other organisations and individuals sharing our content through their channels. The Association account now has 340 followers who have subscribed to our account and see all NSWCUSA content.

Alongside the Association's Twitter presence, the NSWCUSA Facebook page has continued to grow. At the time of writing, the page has 2,656 people who have 'liked' the page, with Association content viewed by over 150,000 people.



Exam Committee - Andrew Coates

It is with great pleasure I provide this report as chair of the Examination Committee.

2020-21 was an interesting season to say the least. The Committee comprised continuing members Kevin Battishill and Sathish Kumar and welcomed new members Roberto Howard and Darren Foster. Ex-Officio Director Geoff Garland also continued his role on the Committee. These dedicated and knowledgeable volunteers were tireless in their efforts to further the Committee's aims around education of the membership. In addition, the Association's Education Officer, Ben Treloar, was a regular attendee at our meetings and provided invaluable assistance and advice.

This Season

This year the Committee focussed on three major areas:

- Ongoing member education at Ordinary General Meetings
- Contributions to the Laws of Cricket questions for the Association database
- Assistance with the supervision and marking of exams conducted by the Association

All of this was done through a combination of virtual meetings and training.

Ongoing Education

Members of the Committee presented content at Ordinary General Meetings throughout the season, both in-person and online. In October, I presented a set of refresher questions on the Laws. In November, Sathish Kumar presented a set of questions based on the SCA men's playing conditions. In December, Roberto Howard used the online quiz tool Kahoot! to present a lighter set of questions at what is, traditionally, the Association's Christmas meeting. In February, Kevin Battishill prepared and presented questions on the Laws of Cricket. In March, Darren Foster produced and presented a series of lost time calculations based on the SCA Playing Conditions. In April, Sathish Kumar again prepared and presented a set of questions on the Laws. Each of these sessions was very well received, often sparking lively discussion amongst the members present at the meeting and those online.

The Committee learnt a great deal about online and hybrid meetings and several improvements were adopted throughout the season. It is expected that this mode of delivery will continue for the foreseeable future.

My thanks are extended to each of the presenters for their diligence and dedication in preparing, reviewing, and presenting quality material, and for their flexibility and adaptability when dealing with a new set of challenges presented by our COVID-enforced circumstances.

Laws of Cricket Questions

Throughout the season, members of the Committee prepared and reviewed Laws of Cricket questions for the pool maintained by the Education Officer. This is an ongoing exercise.

Exam Supervision and Marking

Throughout the season, the Association has conducted training courses and exams almost exclusively online. There has, therefore, been no call for committee members to attend and supervise these in person. However, several members of the Committee have contributed to the online training sessions conducted by the Training team.

Next Season

The Committee feels that the three themes have been successful and meaningful and has resolved to continue using them into next season.

Ongoing Education

We will continue to present at monthly OGMs on Laws of Cricket. Additional sessions will be scheduled outside OGMs for SCA Playing Conditions, as the online nature of the meetings now means that many attendees are not umpiring in SCA competitions.

Laws of Cricket Questions

This will be an ongoing exercise during season 2021-22, with the Committee working closely with the Association's administrative staff to provide further questions on the website.

Exam Supervision and Marking

This will be an ongoing activity undertaken by the Committee.

I would like to express my gratitude to fellow Committee members Christine Bennison, Merilyn Fowler, Kay Wilcoxon, Ian Wright and Ex-Officio Board Director Claire Polosak. As we have seen at games and with well-deserved recognition, this is a deeply experienced and knowledgeable group, serving cricket and the Association for an extended period of time. Claire's background in education is also much valued for what we aim to do in the training space.

Our appreciation for Merilyn's work on the Committee over the last 20 years should also be acknowledged. The amount of effort devoted to advancing scorer training and inclusion is exceptional and Merilyn continues to willingly share her knowledge and support with many in our community.

Another constant is the collective effort of Troy, Darren and Bede alongside the Association's Board and Office-Bearers including Ben Treloar and Andrew Coates. We thank them for continuing to foster and strengthen the knowledge and skill base of the growing membership including support of areas involving scorers.

We were fortunate to be able to resume face-to face scorer training in November and it is great to see a diverse and enthusiastic group of participants attend. Thanks to Brian Freedman and Bankstown Cricket Club for hosting the Sydney-based courses and special mention to Robyn Sanday for organising the Central Coast training venue in Toukley. To our presenters Toni Lorraine, Sue Woodhouse, Christine, Ian and Bede - we appreciate your willingness to share your experience with our trainees.

From a feedback perspective, the interest in accessing online training has increased. Following a review, we are in a position to have reference material for scorers available on our web site – which is a first step in reaching a broader audience. The recording of short training videos is on the planning slate and while we continue to encourage scorers to attend a face-to-face course, we look forward to the benefits of presenting selected theory online.

For members looking to build upon their current experience and who have already completed the Scoring Fundamentals course, there has been interest expressed in a follow-up course to focus on learning and practising more advanced technical skills to record statistics for milestones such as individual batting 50s and 100s as well as batting partnership details. The planning and delivery of this content is also a goal for the coming season.

Two of our long-serving members announced their retirements from representative and regular club scorer duties. Kay Wilcoxon has reached a level that few have done – her record includes appointments to one men's Test and two women's Test matches, 17 other internationals and an additional 18 first-class matches. Kay has also dedicated many years of service to her club Fairfield-Liverpool CC both as First Grade scorer and as a committee member, finishing representative duty at the WBBL Final with Toni Lorraine.

Cheryl Brain is a stalwart at the Campbelltown-Camden club and alongside her many years as a club scorer for men's First Grade, Cheryl has been most willing to score National Championships and State Challenge matches and achieved appointments in men's Second XI matches and International tour matches including a match between the Governor General's XI and India Women.

We celebrate milestones for Sarah Berman, appointed to her first List A and first-class matches and Ian Wright for his men's Test debut, pairing with Toni Lorraine. Social Umpire Appointments - Ian Wright

2020-21 has again been a busy season with many requests for umpires to be provided for pre-season trial matches, social games, school cricket and other matches outside of the usual Premier Cricket, Shires and Masters competitions.

In excess of 185 umpire appointments were made during the season, generally appointments were made to matches in a limited overs format – either 20 or 50 overs per side.

The season began with a large number of appointments to pre-season matches for SCA clubs. Because of COVID, many cricket grounds were still being used for winter sports and the SCA scheduled men's First and Second Grades to begin in the last week of September. A delayed start was necessary for Third, Fourth, Fifth Grade as well as Shires and Women's Premier Cricket competitions. Therefore, these preseason games were spread over a couple of weekends, rather than all being the week before all cricket started. Appointments were made for each of these games.

Umpires were provided for the Rawson Cup, Sydney Uni colleges carnival, Primary Club matches, SCG XI games and CHS Trials carnivals. There were also several Green Shield trial matches to which umpires were appointed. The GPS Schools competition regularly required matches for their Saturday games, with a number of umpires from the Men's Premier Cricket standby list being used nearly every Saturday. For those umpires who are regularly on the standby list, you may wish to consider committing to the GPS competition where you are likely to be appointed each week during the school term.

There were no major school carnivals held in Sydney for which I was requested to supply umpires. Further, Cricket NSW took on the responsibility of appointing umpires for all the Cricket NSW Youth Championships matches.

I was regularly asked to find umpires for vacancies for several competitions outside of the auspices of Cricket NSW. Umpires were invited to express their interest with contact names and details were passed to the organisers to make appointments.

It is usually difficult to find umpires to fulfil requests for umpires on Saturdays, as many of our members are already committed to various competitions. Also often umpires who are on the standby list, are called up at the last minute to fulfil SCA appointments after pull-outs.

My thanks to Troy Penman who advised of umpires not umpiring on Saturdays. I also appreciated the help of Dr. John Colwell, who assisted with advising details of umpires not already appointed to Women's Premier Cricket matches. Thanks also to Darren Goodger, Troy Penman and Bede Sajowitz for their assistance in advising details of matches seeking umpires. They also coordinated appointments on occasion when there was only short notice of the match given - particularly when I was busy involved in scoring duties.

I encourage any member to volunteer for social match appointments, particularly our newer members, and those that are not umpiring regularly in SCA competitions. From time to time I am able to appoint umpires to matches on prestigious grounds including the SCG, Bradman Oval, Sydney Showground Stadium and Blacktown International Sportspark.

Contact with umpires was regularly made by email, it provides a very convenient means of communication to notify games, and to accept appointments. Any members who are not on my email list, please send me your email address and I will add you.

To the organisers of matches, please allow at least a few days, preferably a week, to organise the appointment of umpires. Whilst we were usually able to organise umpires at short notice the more time available, the better chance of finding someone for your matches. Sufficient notice of matches also helps ensure that umpires of an appropriate standard are appointed. If possible, it is preferred that payment be made on the day of the match.

The recommended fee for social matches remained at \$145 this season.

My thanks to all umpires who accepted appointments to the various games throughout the season.

Currently, the New South Wales Cricket Umpires' and Scorers' Association has a total of 44 affiliated associations, made up of 18 metropolitan associations and 26 country associations. Gary Crombie has now stepped down as Central Northern Zone Umpire Representative having relocated to Western Australia. Gary has made a valued contribution to umpiring in the Central North Zone and he is to be thanked for his efforts. Gary has also been a member of the Country Umpire Representative Panel for the past four years. There remains no Zone Umpire Representative for ACT-Southern Districts.

The affiliated associations have continued to be committed to training and development. However, restrictions imposed because of the COVID-19 pandemic impacted on the delivery of personal development and Laws of Cricket courses by NSWCUSA trainers. Consequently, it was only possible to conduct face-to-face Laws of Cricket courses in Lismore and Newcastle. However, it was still possible for numerous aspiring umpires to access the newly developed NSWCUSA on-line Laws of Cricket course.

NSWCUSA was again represented at a large number of the affiliated association's Annual General Meetings, with NSWCUSA Board Directors and Zone Umpire Representatives attending a total of twenty-two AGMs, either in-person or remotely. Having Board representation at these AGMs is an important means of meaningful communication between the Board and the affiliates.

A pleasing development this season has been the increase in the number of female umpires active in affiliated associations. Elisabeth Houston (Central Coast CUA), Erica Looyen (Camden District CUA), Beryl McCormack (Northern Inland CUSA), Lauren McGill (Tamworth District CUSA), Leone Mizzi (Inner West Harbour Umpires' League) and Cathy Russell (Shoalhaven District CUA) have all umpired in their respective cricket competitions this season.

Principal membership of the NSWCUSA was awarded to eight members of affiliated associations at the on-line NSWCUSA Annual General Meeting in September. Each have been members of NSWCUSA for more than 15 years and during this time, have made significant contributions to their respective associations both as umpires and as administrators. SECTION 4 - EDUCATION AND DEVELOPMENT



Education Officer - Ben Treloar

What a year it was. Despite the challenges it presented, the 2020-21 season provided the NSWCUSA Training team with a wonderful opportunity to futureproof itself as we moved our training online because COVID-19 struck the world. Throughout the pandemic we continued to deliver courses on the Laws of Cricket 2017 Code (2nd Edition 2019) and professional development workshops around the State whilst reaching further abroad as well. Our team continued to excel in the education environment due to their willingness to embrace technology and the online world, continually improving their delivery, engagement, and teaching strategies. Their training was enjoyed by many, reaching current and prospective members from all over the State, some nationally and as far away as India, Japan and Singapore.

We saw limited opportunities during the season for face-to-face workshops, but we still managed to visit Lismore and Newcastle for umpire training and development before travel restrictions were reintroduced.

With the introduction of the online training course, we saw Orange plan a hybrid course which would have seen four sessions held online with session five and the assessment to be delivered and administered in-person. COVID-19 put a stop to the regional visit for session five, however we were able to continue and finish the course online.

We also acknowledge the willingness of other Associations that had courses confirmed before travel restrictions were put in place preventing them from going ahead:

Overall, this was an outstanding response to the request for training from our affiliated associations and we look forward to visiting these affiliates in the not too distant future.

The Association extends its thanks to all members who made themselves available, giving their time and sharing experience facilitating courses. Thanks to all the local volunteers for making necessary arrangements for the courses conducted at their respective venues. This is a significant task, both physically and administratively. Trainers are always welcomed with a smile and it is great to see you all. The Association is fortunate to have some very talented facilitators in our ranks as part of the training team, along with a group of loyal local volunteers to allow our education opportunities to run as smoothly as they can.

Trainers prepared to the best of their ability to ensure the courses were delivered in an engaging and insightful fashion. The standard of the courses being delivered is very high. Those in attendance really appreciated the efforts of our trainers, clearly validated by the energy in the room and the questions in the 'chat box' and from a number of emails and phone calls received by the NSWCUSA Management asking to have their thanks passed onto those who presented. Full credit must go to the trainers who continue to hone and develop their educating skills with each opportunity for the benefit of others.

Despite the challenges faced this year, high attendance figures were still seen across the different mediums. This is supported by the more than 156 participants receiving Level Two accreditation since June, all having passed the Association's Laws of Cricket exam. To all the trainers and volunteers, this cannot happen without you. Thank you. An achievement as an Association we can all be proud of.

In addition to umpire training courses, the Association's Annual Convention was conducted virtually.

A key aim was to support those who are new to umpiring and assist them to navigate through their first season of umpiring. The online environment was definitely a challenge this year, not only for the training team but also for members who engaged with the online content. Each year the program's content is continually updated to reflect the needs of our members and we look forward to working with those who are commencing their umpiring journey with us in season 2021-22.

A continued initiative this year has seen the dissemination of monthly law questions as a learning resource for the benefit of Association members and affiliates. Thanks to the members of the Examination Committee, led once again by Chair Andrew Coates. The Committee provide the foundation of the questions each month. They are and continue to be a high-quality resource, always thought-provoking. They were shared the day following each month's OGM with the answers distributed a week later. This is an initiative we are looking forward to continuing into season 2021-22 and beyond.

Female Engagement/Umpire Educator - Claire Polosak

The 2020-21 pre-season training for female umpires in New South Wales looked a little different this year. Instead of coming together for a day of activities, there were a few sessions held online using Zoom, including:

- Fieldcraft and routines, with Ben Treloar and Claire Polosak
- General Q and A that was aimed at beginner umpires, with Sue Redfern (ICC/ECB Umpire) and Claire Polosak
- Female-specific nutrition information session, with sports nutritionist Sally Anderson



Throughout the season, there were 22 females umpiring cricket across the State, an increase of one female umpire from last year. We did lose a couple of female umpires during the off-season as a result of relocation, family and work reasons. The 22 female umpires were appointed a total of 330 times throughout the season, which is a 15% increase on 2019-20. This is despite shortened seasons in many areas and less opportunities for representative appointments. A breakdown of the appointments and the competitions can be seen below, with comparison to last season:

While there was a decrease in female appointments to Sydney Cricket Association Men's and Women's matches and Cricket NSW Pathway matches, there were dramatic increases in the Youth Championships (+38%) and appointments in affiliated association competitions (+138%). This increase shows the fantastic work that is occurring in the affiliated associations. Associations that we are aware of where females are regularly umpiring include:


There were also two mid-season female umpire development training sessions. The first was held online in January, facilitated by Ben Treloar, which was based around Laws and specific questions that had arisen throughout the season. The other session was held in a hybrid format in March, at the Cricket NSW office at Sydney Olympic Park. Thanks to Gerard Abood for candidly sharing his experiences around umpiring, decision making and strategies to ensure we are learning the most out of experiences on field.

This was the largest female training session to date, with 17 attendees - nine who joined online and eight present in person.

Thanks to the investment that Cricket NSW continues to make for female umpire development, New South Wales still features very strongly in comparison to other states with regard to the number of female umpires and the training and support the umpires are receiving. New South Wales accounts for 55% of all female umpires in Australia, which is an increase from 50% in 2019.

Sue Gregory and Elizabeth O'Dwyer also made their Second Grade debuts in NSW Men's Premier Cricket this year, congratulations to you both.

Female Umpire Scholarship Program

2020 was the second and final year of the ICC T20 World Cup Legacy Funding Grant. Funds were again available in the form of three \$1,000 scholarships available for female umpires. This year the three recipients were Erica Looyen, Lauren McGill and Manjinder Sandhu. All three have used the funding to improve their own umpiring throughout the year, including funds spent on attending on field opportunities as well as in areas of personal development off field.

Cricket Australia Female Umpire Program

At the end of 2020, Cricket Australia made available funding that can be used for improving the opportunities for female umpires at a local and Premier Cricket level. NSWCUSA was successful in the application for \$5,000 that can be used by affiliated associations for recruitment, training and development of female umpires. This funding is to be spent across the next 12 months, throughout the winter and across the next season.

Community Officiating Accreditation

During 2020 the Community Officiating workshops were adapted to suit the online environment. A total of 20 workshops were held and 362 participants were put through the Cricket Australia Community Officiating Accreditation. While online training cannot completely replace face to face education, it does allow for much more variety in the geographical locations we are able to reach and provide educational opportunities to.

The Training team discovered that in the online environment, there really needed to be at least two facilitators for each workshop to provide the most positive experience for participants as possible. Thanks must be given to Ben Treloar and Bede Sajowitz for their assistance throughout the year with the smooth facilitation of the workshops.

For the first time this year, the NSW Department of Education Schools Sports Unit (SSU) approached Cricket NSW to provide some upskilling to their sports teachers around the state in the space of cricket officiating. Two workshops were held in the lead up to the school season starting, with a total of 33 teachers receiving the training.

Feedback received showed that the training improved their knowledge and confidence to facilitate a cricket match for students.

Thank you also to the staff in the Cricket NSW Community Cricket Department; without their assistance in providing local contacts and support with advertising the Cricket Australia Community Officiating workshops in their respective areas, it would have proved much harder to find participants in the various areas.

Convention - Ben Treloar

No doubt this phrase will feature a few times throughout this Annual Report, but season 2020-21 was a year like no other, providing challenging situations wherever you looked. The training team knew that to prepare the Association for season 2020-21 where COVID-19 would prevent us from staging our traditional face-to-face weekends, we would need to think outside the box to provide a similar standard of training and education. Brainstorming the possible ways that preseason training and development could still be provided for our members led to us discussing how we could hold the 2020 Annual Convention virtually. We started with the idea of having two or three live sessions, however, we wound up with a week-long online program that consisted of both live and pre-recorded sessions that had the main objective of adding to the 'umpiring toolkit' of members and providing focus areas for individuals preparing for the new season. The theme that tied the presentations together was 'embrace', a concept not only for umpiring and cricket, but for most things during 2020.

The week-long program included ten live sessions and the sharing of four prerecorded films. The Convention events took place from Saturday 12 September to Friday 18 September. Many members volunteered their time to facilitate sessions, preparing for many hours to present content. Thank you to those who gave time, shared their expertise and experience for the benefit of members, we are very grateful. Also, thank you to our contributors from outside the Association, all are experts in their respective fields and provided relevant and engaging resources to be used for many years to come.

A summary of the live sessions that were facilitated:

- Panel discussion led by Mel Jones, former Australian player and current commentator. The panel comprised of Gerard Abood, Claire Polosak and Paul Wilson. The group discussed a wide variety of umpiring issues kicking off the convention with positive energy and enthusiasm.
- Hugh Van Cuylenburg, founder of The Resilience Project, presented around building resilience and looking after our mental health and also developing happiness using the principles 'GEM' gratitude, empathy and mindfulness.

- Ben Treloar presented two Laws of Cricket sessions, with members welcome to attend either, or both. One session was based around general law scenarios for umpires, and the other was based around the laws that are more specific in scoring situations. Answers to pre-distributed questions were discussed and it was great to see so many members tune in.
- Sally Anderson, an advanced sports nutritionist, provided a very enthusiastic session about nutritional information and an overview and insight as to how to make informed food decisions. There were so many questions for Sally that we invited her back for a follow-up session held in October to ensure all questions could be answered.
- Greg Davidson, Simon Lightbody and Tony Wilds, three of the Association's umpires who are contracted to Cricket Australia, presented around preparation, self-assessment and teamwork.
- Simon Taufel presented about leadership in the match official environment, ways to identify opportunities to lead and what it looks like in match situations.
- Ian Wright presented about the possible scenarios at the end of the match and how to ensure the books balance.
- Christine Bennison and Narelle Johnston held a question and answer session, where anything related to scoring was discussed, from beginning scoring careers, to getting through the representative scorer pathway.

The pre-recorded sessions proved to be very popular, receiving 695 views during the week of the convention. These sessions were provided by the Country Umpire Representative Panel, the NSW Men's Premier Cricket Observer Team, baseball umpire Tom West and athletics coach Chris Nunn returned, who many members would already know from previous presentations at the Wagga Wagga and Bankston conventions.

While nothing can fully replace the face-to-face convention, as not only a way of preparing for the new season, but also for the social opportunity to catch up with friends from around the state, many members truly embraced the online setting, with presentations having been attended or watched over 1600 times, both during and since the Convention. The presentations were added to the Association's website and most remain available for all members to access at their leisure.

Observers - Bob Davis

Prior the start of the 2020-21 season, our most experienced and highly-regarded observer, Graham Reed, advised of his retirement from this role after 29 years. The Observer team has benefited throughout the season from his continuing interest, assistance and wise guidance from the sidelines, which has been greatly appreciated.

Berend du Plessis was appointed as a Men's Premier Cricket observer this season. Berend has great knowledge of umpiring, demonstrated mentoring skills and a genuine passion for match officiating and for cricket, and his work as an observer during the season has been of the highest standard, and appreciated by all whom he has met.

So, during the 2020-21 season, six off-field observers (Errol Cranney, Graham Chudleigh, Bob Davis, Berend du Plessis, Laurie Borg and Rupert Matthews) have been observing umpires officiating in Men's Premier Cricket matches. All are themselves former umpires.

The COVID-19 restrictions affected NSW Men's Premier Cricket in many ways, and the observers were no exception. With the Annual Convention being an online affair this season, the observer team prepared a training video for new umpires, with outstanding assistance from Claire Polosak, and we were very pleased with the response to it.

267 observations were made of 146 umpires during the season, including visiting regional and Shires umpires.

Observers usually discuss what they have seen with the umpires at the end of a session, or of the day's play, to provide immediate feedback, suggestions, advice and encouragement to the umpires observed, and to provide an opportunity for them to ask questions. A formal report is later prepared and sent, via the Education Officer, Ben Treloar, to each umpire for reference. Many umpires have replied, thanking Ben and the observer for the reports, and we appreciate these kind responses.

Observers will usually speak informally with one or both captains during a match, to get their thoughts on the umpires' performance. Most captains understand the role of the Observer, and provide thoughtful and constructive comments for the development of umpires. Captains continue to comment favourably on the year-on-year improvement in the standard of umpiring, a tribute to our Association's Education and Development team, and to the dedication of our umpires themselves.

The observers aim to ensure that new umpires have a sound grounding in basic umpiring techniques as quickly as possible, on which to build more advanced ones. We assist the more experienced umpires with the finer details of best practice, including the 'one-percenters' which occur in unusual circumstances.

We are delighted to continue to report the high levels of preparation, teamwork and communication amongst umpires. These characteristics are essential at the higher grades, and umpires at all levels have demonstrated strong evidence of improving these skills. These areas require continuous and consistent effort for success.

We were also impressed with the implementation of the COVID-19 rules laid down by the SCA. Umpires were well prepared and knowledgeable about the new rules, and all players followed umpires' instructions without question, ensuring the risk of any possible transmission of the virus was minimised as much as possible.

Umpires are encouraged to prepare a short list of match goals, actions which the umpire intends to focus on during the match. This has proved exceptionally useful, significantly aids match preparation, and is strongly recommended to all umpires. Observers monitor match goals and provide feedback to the umpires on their success in achieving them.

Some of the more common things suggested by observers to umpires, especially those early in their career, include:

• Regularly review the Laws of Cricket and review the relevant playing conditions prior to each match.

- Umpires may be forgiven for an error of judgement on a decision but won't be for a mistake in applying Laws or PCs. Note the differences between each type of game.
- Each month, our Education Officer, Ben Treloar, sends out a short list of questions on the laws and their implementation. This is an excellent resource, and all umpires are strongly encouraged to test their knowledge using them.
- Dress neatly when travelling to the ground, so that on arrival you give a good impression to the players. For the toss, be in your umpire uniform (shirt, trousers, shoes, name badge, and cap if you wish); don't forget to carry a coin!
- The presentation of any decision establishes the umpire's level of respect among the players; any appearance of indecision is undesirable. Stand still while considering an appeal, when giving the decision, and even for a moment or two afterwards. Any movement forwards or backwards may give the perception of uncertainty to players and spectators, and finger speed is critical not too fast, not too slow. When giving not-out, a slight shake of the head ensures that all players and spectators are aware of your decision. Don't look at your counter until well after the decision has been made.
- When you give a batter out, look them in the eye as you raise your finger. This gives the impression to all the players that you are confident with your decision. Don't look at the ground or fiddle with your counter.
- After a wicket falls, and the stumps have been rebuilt, the umpires should come together, standing with a good view of the pitch and the gate, so that they can:
 - prevent any damage to the pitch
 - watch the dismissed batsman leaving the ground, in case of any indiscretion or send-offs
 - see the incoming batsman arrive, noting whether he's right or left-handed.
- When at the bowler's end, and the batsmen start to run, walk briskly to a position square of the pitch, in line with the batting crease. Aim to be there, and with your head still, when the batsmen complete the first run, ready to adjudicate on a short run or run-out.
- Avoid initiating a conversation with a player on the field, and keep any responses short. Only address a player if there is a game-based reason to do so. Leave any chit-chat to the end of the match.
- If an explanation for a decision is sought by a player, provide a concise answer: an excellent decision can be ruined by a poor explanation.

- Never offer an explanation (either verbal or by gesture) unless asked.
- When talking with captains, always do so together, and without other players or officials present; let the captains tell their teammates about any decisions made. A united presentation by both umpires gives the strong impression that we are a coherent team. Remember to notify scorers of any decisions which may affect them.
- Always watch the play until after the ball has gone dead before looking at your counter; the number on the counter is always less important than a possible run-out.
- Likewise, always wait until after the ball is dead before signalling to the scorers.
- At all times, especially during a change of over, at least one of the umpires should be watching the pitch. If you are the umpire moving to square leg, linger near the pitch to keep an eye on it, as well as the players and the ball, until your partner arrives at the bowler's end, when this duty is handed over, and you can walk to square leg; consider backing away to your position, so that you can continue to keep an eye on the pitch area. Don't write in your notebook while waiting for your partner to take control; your principal task is to monitor the pitch, ball and players.
- If the ball hits the fence hard, disappears from view, or strikes concrete, asphalt, or other solid surface, one of the umpires must inspect the ball on its return to the field, to ensure that it is the same ball and the umpire knows the state of the ball. We were pleased to see that umpires followed the COVID-19 rules when doing so.
- After the ball goes dead, aim to relax ('switch down') while the ball is returned to the bowler. Switch-up again when the bowler starts their run-up.
- When at the striker's end, stand about a pitch-length from the pitch, but adjust your distance to suit the bowler's speed and the position of fielders. Late in the afternoon, consider moving to the opposite side if the sun is low, to avoid looking into the sun, and to see pitch markings more clearly.
- When left and right-handed batsmen are at the crease, and you plan to cross when singles are run, anticipate crossing over. When the batter starts to run, take a few steps towards the pitch and watch them running from there. If the batsmen run a single, walk (don't run) to the opposite side; you're already some of the way there, so you'll save time getting across. If they run two, take a few steps backwards to return to your original position.

- Be careful not to give ambiguous signals to your partner when you are at the striker's end: stand with your hands beside or behind you; hands together in front of you could be inadvertently interpreted by your partner as an indication that the batter had hit the ball with their bat.
- Always be ready to help your partner: regular eye contact during each over, and unambiguous and reliable signals for all common events, present the appearance of teamwork to captains and players. When at the striker's end, between deliveries, turn a little towards your partner, so that you will see any signal from the bowler's end umpire.
- During a drinks break, or when leaving the field for an interval, let the fielding captain know how many overs have been bowled so far, and indicate whether this is ahead or behind the daily average (as a guide, this is about 16 overs per hour for a two-day match). This will help the captain to ensure that he manages their over-rate and avoids any penalties.
- After a drinks break, call the players back to the game promptly. Sometimes the fielders go into a huddle after drinks, using up valuable playing time.

Observers participate as selectors for the NSW Men's Premier Cricket umpire panels, and for the appointment of umpires to the final series. The Observers take this duty very seriously, and with so many excellent umpires available for the competition, this is no easy task: it takes several hours of intensive effort to complete these tasks.

We are grateful to the State Umpiring Manager, Darren Goodger, and the administration team (Troy, Bede, Claire and Ben), for their support, advice and encouragement throughout the season.

We thank all the umpires in NSW Men's Premier Cricket for the spirit in which our activities have been received. We are grateful for your understanding of our role, and appreciate your support throughout the season. Like umpires, we have an intention to improve the service we provide: if you have any suggestions to help us, please advise any of us, the Education Officer or the State Umpiring Manager.

EDUCATION AND DEVELOPMENT


Jobs were not only maintained at Cricket NSW through the pandemic, but additional hires were made during 2020-21.

Upper Hunter Cricket Umpires' and Scorers' Association:

The past 12 months have been riddled with adversities due to the pandemic. In several ways, it gave our Association an opportunity to refocus. Fortunately, we were lucky enough to receive an allocation of the Grassroots Sports Fund from Cricket NSW. This provided the finance necessary to achieve our main aim in that period of increasing the knowledge of the Laws of Cricket and increase the numbers in our diminished umpire ranks.

The UHCUSA organised and ran three local umpire courses targeting people who wish to only umpire junior and local cricket matches in our local district cricket associations. A strong new network was established, especially critical to our success was the assistance of Tom Lewis (Cessnock) and Daniel Storey (Singleton). Two courses were held at Greta, which saw fourteen of the fifteen participants pass and at Singleton, nine passed our session examination that includes Laws of Cricket basics and dangerous and unreasonable conditions. All successful participants (25 of them) have joined their appropriate Umpire and Scorers Associations. The aim we hope is now a number will go on and achieve their NSWCUSA qualifications.

In the current environment there has been increased workload for the few active NSWCUSA accredited umpires, the greatest challenge we faced in the Central North Zone was the creation of a junior Sunday competition with most towns across the Zone travelling and participating. This was achieved through a combined effort from Steve Eccles (Scone), Ian James (Tamworth) and David Merchant (Maitland) who worked together to organise umpire appointments throughout the Zone.

The main challenges, as always, for the UHCUSA is firstly keeping umpires, secondly recruiting new umpires and thirdly getting members to actually umpire matches. We have 26 members, unfortunately only three regularly umpire and one who scores regularly.

Steve Eccles had the honour to stand in his daughter's T20 match to raise money for a cancer charity. One of Steve's daughter's club members has been fighting cancer for over 12 months.

The match saw a staggering \$4,800 raised on the day and thousands extra coming in on the days that followed. A huge effort by all the girls involved.

SECTION 6 - CRICKET ASSOCIATIONS



NSW Cricket Association - Mark Hughes

NSWCUSA is one of a number of associations that provide a delegate to meetings of the New South Wales Cricket Association. All 20 NSW Men's Premier Cricket clubs are represented, along with the eight country zones, the ACT Cricket Association, NSW Districts Cricket Association, NSW Women's Premier Cricket and Sydney Shires, along with Appointed Directors of the NSW Cricket Board.

This was my fifth season as the NSWCUSA representative to these meetings.

The Annual General Meeting was held in September 2020 and saw the reappointment of NSWCA patrons Mr. Alan Davidson AM MBE, The Hon. John Howard OM AC and The Hon. Margaret Beazley AO QC.

Michael Clarke and Karen Price were nominated by the Board to be elected as Life members of the NSWCA.

No election was held for the positions of three directors to the NSW Cricket Board at the AGM; with The Hon. Kevin Greene, Mr. Paul Marjoribanks and Mr. Neil Maxwell taking the positions vacated from the expiring Board positions. The AGM also saw the appointment of Ms. Karen Robbins to the NSW Cricket Board. During the year, Mr. Mike Baird AO resigned from the board to take up a position on the board of Cricket Australia, with delegates confirming the appointment of Mr. David Gallop to the CNSW board in his place.

Annual financial statements were tabled showing NSWCA to be in a strong financial position with revenues of \$55m, expenses of \$51m and surplus after abnormal items of \$3.3m. Total equity increased as net assets held by Cricket NSW were in excess of \$27.1m.

During the year, performances from New South Wales representative teams were strong at a senior level. New South Wales finished the season making the Sheffield Shield Final, but losing to Queensland in Brisbane. The Blues won the One-Day Cup defeating Western Australia in the final at Bankstown Oval and the Breakers finished fourth in the Women's National Cricket League.

In the BBL the Sydney Sixers defeated Perth Scorchers in the final at the SCG, with the Thunder finishing fourth after losing to the Heat in the finals. In the WBBL the Sydney Thunder won the title, defeating Melbourne Stars in the final at North Sydney Oval, with the Sixers failing to make the finals finishing in fifth on the competition table.

At meetings during the year, delegates were provided with presentations and updates on the Wilson Park development at Silverwater where Cricket NSW offices will be located, with a target completion date in 2022. The facility at cost of \$58m will include an ICC field and junior size field, 15 lane indoor facility, 46 outdoor turf wickets in Stage 1 and a further 30 in Stage 2 of the development. Also included in the complex will be gym, recovery and high performance and administration facilities.

COVID-19 has had a significant impact on cricket across Australia and our State in the last 12 months. Responding to the pandemic and the creation of a cricket continuity plan was a key presentation to delegates in June 2020, with Cricket NSW committing to spending significant reserves to maintain staffing and programs as much as possible for this financial year. A significant loss/deficit of \$1.5m was budgeted for in 2020-21. Our state was the only one in the country that did not reduce staff numbers in response to loss of revenues associated with the current economic climate.

Delegates were also provided regular updates from Chief Executive Officer Lee Germon. At each delegates' meeting Mr. Germon reminded delegates of the importance of our values, how we play the game, a revised vision, for cricket to be New South Wales' most loved and successful sport and for CNSW to be regarded as a world class organisation, and purpose, to inspire everyone to love cricket. Delegates were presented at the April meeting a copy of the Cricket NSW Strategic Plan for 2021-25 and Organisational Design Summary.

The Strategic Plan presented focuses on CNSW moving from a product driven to customer focused organisation, aiming to simplify the way cricket is delivered. It aims for unity for the betterment of cricket in working with Cricket Australia and the other states to grow the game, and putting protections in place regarding places to play and facilities. The organisational restructure was presented placing staff into four squads, Cricket Performance (where the match officials staff are placed), Customer and Employee Experience, Cricket Business Services and Strategy, Governance and Insights.

Reports at delegates' meetings this year were also provided on the male high performance programs and updates on participation programs in the state. Open forums were also included on agendas so delegates to raise and discuss any questions delegates may wish to ask to both Board and Management of Cricket NSW.

We were often reminded of the excellent work of our match official staff at Cricket NSW and were again acknowledged for providing 100% coverage of NSW Men's Premier Cricket and Sydney Shires. It was noted in the high performance review that umpiring development and progression in New South Wales is regarded as the best in Australia. This is a wonderful achievement and an excellent reflection on the work from our hardworking team on staff at Cricket NSW.

A total of 189 umpires officiated in Men's Premier Cricket in season 2020-21.

The Administrator was responsible for the coordination of umpire payments. Their names are listed in the State Umpiring Manager report. It is a highly rewarding experience. Members who wish to do so are encouraged to contact the Executive Officer to express their interest. All will be made most welcome and appointed to umpire in a grade, with an experienced colleague, commensurate with ability and experience.

Country umpires who officiate in NSW Men's Premier Cricket seem to enjoy and gain benefit from the experience, and they certainly add value to the competition when they travel to Sydney to umpire, being well received and welcomed by players and clubs.

SECTION 7 - FINANCE, COMMENTS AND CONCLUSION



Treasurer's Report - Laurie Borg

The Treasurer's Report contains the Statement of Assets and Liabilities together with the Statement of Income and Expenditure for NSWCUSA in its 108th year ending 30 April 2021.

Statement of Income and Expenditure

The Association's overall result was a surplus of \$56,287.17.

Income totalled \$139,999.33 with the main components being:

- Umpire Service and Accreditation Grants \$70,995.46.
- Merchandise sales resulted in \$14,171.66, representing a loss of \$10,138.60 which occurred for two reasons:
 - The continued low-price reduction sale of Centenary merchandise.
 - In the second year of the reduced Beastwear sponsorship the Association new members with field shirts at a minimal cost of \$10 per shirt, please note that this loss was to be reduced by the McDonald's sponsorship that is still in negotiation with Cricket NSW.
- Member and affiliated association subscriptions totalled \$62,002.20 again the backbone of our income.

Expenditure totalled \$83,712.16 which is a 30.5% decrease on 2019-20:

Administration Expenses

- The total cost of the 2019-20 Annual Report was \$3,120.00 a 52.4% reduction due to the great work done by Troy and Bede in preparation and formatting.
- General expenses of \$877.87 which is a reduction on 2019-20.
- Honoraria of \$11,300 paid to recognise the continuing wonderful contribution of our hard-working volunteers.
- Funds paid to Cricket NSW for rental of four workstations, plus other payments paid to staff as approved by the Board for their outstanding efforts on behalf of NSWCUSA, totalled \$17,442.16.

Training Expenses

- The Board is committed to subsidising the cost of education and development programs for members.
- The Convention returned a loss of \$7,670.02. A great Convention was delivered by the training team through the new on-line environment that gave more of our members the opportunity to engage.
- The continued concentration on the training and development of umpires and scorers saw a spend of \$21,779.73, a 59.4% reduction on 2019-20. This reduction was a result of the lack of face-to-face training programs in regional areas thanks to COVID, however the training team, led by Ben Treloar, was able to deliver an online program to prospective umpires.

Hospitality

The Annual Dinner and Awards Presentation was held at Bankstown Sports Club at a net cost of \$15,081.21. Thanks to our guest speaker Bill Harrigan and the MC Samad Shaikh. The work by the staff was again outstanding for the enjoyment of our members.

Statement of Assets and Liabilities

Total cash and deposits as at 30 April 2021 amounted to \$237,809.23. The Association is able to meet its ongoing financial contribution to Cricket NSW for the match officials team into the future.
